Scholarships for Military Spouses

Green Beret Foundation Athena Scholarship

The Green Beret Foundation will award six Special Forces spouses who are pursuing their **undergraduate** or **graduate** degrees with \$5,000 each. Funds will be paid directly to the educational institutions.

Application Window: Feb 1 through March 15

National Military Family Association - Joanne Holbrook Patton Military Spouse Scholarship Funds may be used for tuition, course or lab fees, program costs, program fees or exam costs/fees. In addition to college courses towards *any* level degree or certificate, scholarship funds may be used for professional expenses such as licensure/certification (or renewal), CEU's, professional examinations and other related expenses such as fingerprinting and background check fees, or clinical supervision of mental health license hours. Business Owners: Funding can be used for military spouse-owned business needs including, but not limited to: inventory and merchandise, business marketing, branding, manufacturing, supplies, permits, additional supplies.

Pat Tillman Foundation

Last Updated: 8 January 2025

Active-duty personnel, veterans, and their **spouses (this includes surviving spouses)** may apply for this scholarship that honors remarkable service members pursuing an **undergraduate**, **graduate**, or **professional degree**. Applicants who are selected are recognized as "Pat Tillman Scholars" and are invited to professional workshops and training. The application includes two essay questions, a character recommendation, and proof of military service. Students must enroll full time in a degree program. Scholarship amount average is \$10,000 per academic year.

Ms. Patty Shinseki Spouse Scholarship Program

The Mrs. Patty Shinseki Spouse Scholarship Program provides Spouses of active duty or retired Soldiers, and widows(ers) of Soldiers who died either on active duty or in a retired status, with financial assistance to pursue their **first undergraduate college degree**. Spouses of National Guard/Reserve Soldiers activated on Title 10 Orders are also eligible. Spouses of Soldiers who have separated from the Army without retiring are not eligible. Scholarships are based solely on **financial need**.

Folds of Honor

Dependents and/or spouses of **fallen**, **disabled**, and **Purple Heart** recipient service members pursuing higher education can apply for the Military Higher Education scholarship.

Classification must be one of the following:

• KIA – must provide DD1300

Last Updated: 8 January 2025

- Killed in the Line of Duty (includes suicide) must provide DD1300
- Deceased with a VA disability rating post separation (includes accident, illness or suicide) must provide service member's DD214 AND the following applicable document(s):
 - If death was deemed service-connected: Service member's VA Decision Letter verifying the service member died due to a service-connected disability, OR
 - If death not deemed service-connected: Service member's final VA Benefit Summary Letter (10% or higher), AND a state-issued death certificate
- Disabled with a VA disability rating (10% or higher for Higher Education) must provide service member's current year VA Benefit Summary Letter AND DD214
- Active Duty (MUST have a PURPLE HEART) must provide service member's current duty orders AND Purple Heart documentation. *Only applicable for Higher Education applicants*

Scholarships for Military Children

Special Operations Warrior Foundation - (Pre-school to Career)

Special Operations Warrior Foundation ensures complete post-secondary educational support and additional educational opportunities "cradle to career," for eligible surviving children of fallen Special Operations Personnel, children of all Medal of Honor Recipients, and children of active duty Special Operations Personnel whose non-military spouse passes away on or before September 1, 2018; and provides immediate financial assistance to severely wounded, ill, and injured Special Operations Personnel — today and in the future.

Duskin & Stephens Foundation - (K-12)

The Duskin and Stephens Foundation has historically awarded \$3,000 of tuition per year for up to three years paid directly to each recipient's school. The scholarships will cover up to \$3,000 of the tuition costs per year for three consecutive years - for a total award of \$9,000.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Applicant's legal guardian is a current Special Operations Soldier, Sailor, or Marine OR applicant is a Gold Star family member of a former SOF soldier.
- Applicant is a rising K-12th grader who attends a state or federally accredited private school.

Folds of Honor - (K-12)

Scholarships for dependents of fallen or disabled service members in **K-12** can apply for the **Military Children's Fund** scholarship. Applicant must be: enrolled or planning to enroll in an accredited private school OR tutoring institution (must be fully enrolled before accepting a scholarship award offer).

Classification must be one of the following:

• KIA - must provide DD1300

Last Updated: 8 January 2025

- Killed in the Line of Duty (includes suicide) must provide DD1300
- Deceased with a VA disability rating post separation (includes accident, illness or suicide) must provide service member's DD214 AND the following applicable document(s):
 - If death was deemed service-connected: Service member's VA Decision Letter verifying the service member died due to a service-connected disability, OR
 - o If death was not deemed service-connected: Service member's final VA Benefit Summary Letter (90% or higher), AND a state-issued death certificate.

• Disabled with a VA disability rating (90% or higher for Children's Fund) - must provide service member's current year VA Benefit Summary Letter AND DD214.

SFA Scholarship - Children and Grandchildren

The Special Forces Association scholarship fund was established to help **dependents** and **grandchildren** of Special Forces Association members pursuing collegiate academic goals. Awardees serve as a local voice for the Special Forces Association and community, representing the motto of Special Forces, "De Oppresso Liber", helping others towards freedom from oppression. This SFA scholarship is highly competitive.

Special Forces Scholarship Fund Powered by Green Beret Foundation

Scholarships are awarded annually and limited to **undergraduate** and **graduate** studies that result in a degree or **vocational certification** from an accredited institution. SF Scholars will receive no more than four (4) annual scholarships for undergraduate studies and two (2) scholarships for graduate studies.

American Legion

The American Legion's scholarships provide financial assistance to high school students with exceptional academic and leadership qualities, including those participating in youth programs or connected to military service. There are various scholarships available, each with specific requirements and application windows.

The American Legion Legacy Scholarship is a **needs-based** scholarship for the children of U.S. military members who died while on active duty on or after Sept. 11, 2001, as well as children of **post-9/11 veterans** having been assigned a **combined disability rating of 50 percent or greater** by the Department of Veterans Affairs also qualify.

Mai. Gen. James Ursano Scholarship Program

Dependent Children -active, retired, deceased while active.

The Maj. Gen. James Ursano Scholarship Program is based on **applicants' financial needs** and was established to assist Children of Soldiers in obtaining their first **undergraduate** degrees. Applicants may receive assistance for up to four academic years but must meet eligibility criteria and reapply each year.

<u>Fisher House Foundation - Scholarships for Military Children Program</u>

Unmarried military dependent children under the age of 23 - active, reserve/guard, deceased, or retired

500 scholarship grants, each for \$2,000, will be awarded to scholarship recipients There is at least one recipient selected at every commissary location where qualified applications are received. Additional recipients are chosen on a prorated basis. Therefore, more applicants may be selected from those commissaries with more significant numbers of applicants.

No Greater Sacrifice (NGS) is dedicated to the children of our nation's **fallen and wounded Service members** (post 9/11/01) by delivering scholarships and resources to improve their quality of life through the pursuit of higher education. NGS defines "higher education" as advanced learning through a bachelor's degree or associate's degree from an approved institution or certificate from a trade school.

Scholarships for Green Berets

Veterans Affairs GI Bill

If you qualify for the maximum benefit, we'll cover the full cost of public, in-state tuition and fees. We cap the rates for private and foreign schools, and update those rates each year.

- **Money for housing (if you're in school more than half time).** We'll base your monthly housing allowance on the cost of living where your school is located.
- **Money for books and supplies.** You can receive up to the maximum stipend per school year.
- **Money to help you move from a rural area to go to school.** You may qualify for a one-time payment if you live in a county with 6 or fewer people per square mile and you're either moving at least 500 miles to go to school or have no other option but to fly by plane to get to your school.

CSM (Ret) Bennie Adkins Scholarship Powered by GBF

This educational scholarship is provided to deserving Special Forces qualified personnel seeking higher education as a means of assisting in their transition into civilian life. Scholarship funds can be used for tuition, books, fees, room and board, and other direct associated costs of higher education Funds will be transferred directly to the accredited institution.

Eligibility:

- Eligible candidates must be active-duty Special Forces soldiers, have recently separated within the last five years, or be retired within the previous five years.
- The applicant must have been accepted by or already attending an accredited college, university, or vocational institution.

CPT James Ahn Memorial Scholarship

Captain James Ahn, a graduate of UC Riverside and the Claremont McKenna College Army ROTC program, died in 2015 during a parachute training operation while participating with his Special Forces unit in Washington State. In James' honor, we are sponsoring an annual scholarship of \$1,000 to a Special Forces **Veteran** who is working towards the completion of a higher education degree.

LunaCap Foundation

LunaCap Foundation awards scholarships to active military, veterans, and/or students of Mexican descent entering **their first, full-time** top-tier MBA program at an **eligible school**.

Ten - \$10,000, one-time, need-based scholarships awarded annually each July to help offset the cost of education for eligible candidates attending top-tier MBA school programs, (see eligible MBA schools on application).

The Farmer Veteran Fellowship Fund is a small grant program that provides direct assistance to veterans who are in their beginning years of farming or ranching. Awards range from \$1,000 to \$5,000.
